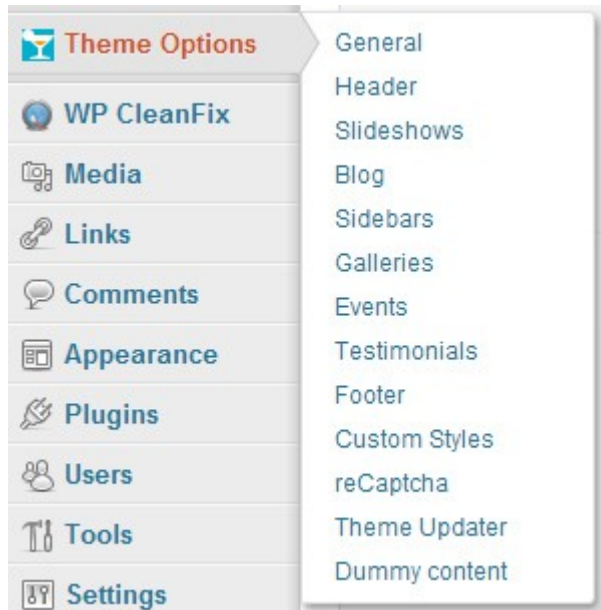

General Settings

In General Settings you can find options related to the entire site such as fonts, favicon, content colors and more.

To edit general settings navigate to **Theme Options** -> **General** page at your Dashboard.



Choose a Font

You can change headings font for the whole website. Simply choose from hundreds of available google fonts from the dropdown.

Favicon URL

Favicon is a small icon that browsers use for your website to make it more recognizable, for example in your bookmarks or history. If a website has a favicon then you will usually see it to the left of the address bar or in browser tab. You need to type full URL to your favicon.ico (i.e.: <http://Themoholics.com/images/favicon.ico>)

Disable login page styling

By default login page has our custom styling. If you want to disable it and switch to the default WordPress login page styling, simply turn on this option.

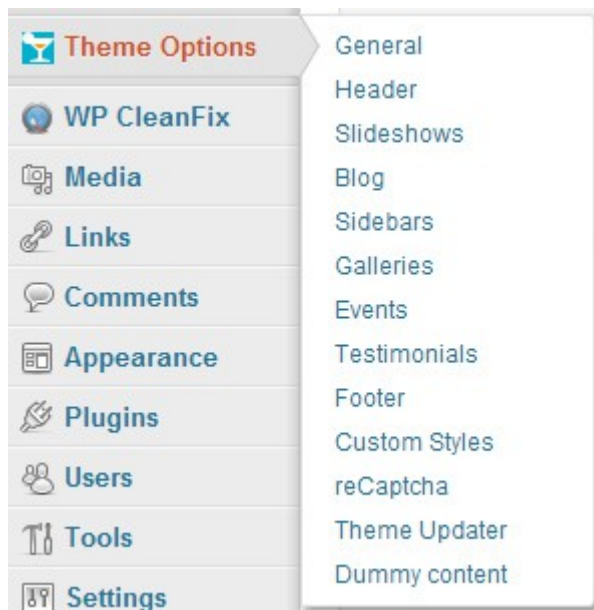

Header Settings

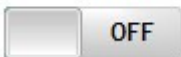

Call to action header ribbon URL

This field is responsible for the fancy call to action ribbon that you can find at the top of the website. You are able to set custom link to your ribbon, or remove ribbon. **To remove call to action ribbon**, simply leave this field completely empty, even without spaces!

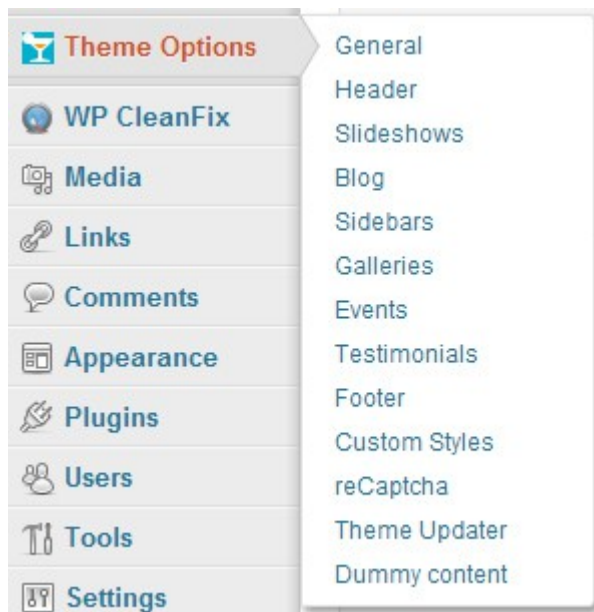

Slideshow Settings

Using global settings you can set settings for slideshow that will be used by default for each page/post. You can set such settings as autoplay, pause, navigation arrows, slideshow height, etc.

To edit slideshow settings navigate to **Theme Options -> Slideshow** page at your Dashboard.



Introduction

Using global settings you can set settings for slideshow that will be used by default for each page/post. So it is best to create global slideshow if you want to have same slideshow on every page of your website. But if you want to create different slideshow for different pages then you need to disable slideshow in this settings and set it locally for each page/post.

If you set slideshow locally in page settings, global slideshow options like category, how many slides to display, timeout, speed, etc. will be ignored and used from local page settings.

To make global settings work you need to make sure that, for example, slideshow type in page/posts settings is set to **Use global**.

Basic Slideshow Settings

To make slideshow work you need to set slideshow type and category. Our theme comes only with two slideshow types or custom Jcycle slideshow & Revolution, third option is to disable slideshow. For Revolutions slideshow, you can choose which of slideshows to use. **All other options at this page is for JCycle slideshow only. To setup Revolution Slider navigate to Dashboard -> Revolution Slider**

For JCycle slideshow you need to choose what category to use and set how many slides to display. But note that all of these settings will be set only for global slideshow.

Slideshow Timeout and Speed

Here you can set slideshow transition speed (speed of animation) and slideshow timeout (how long it will wait before switch to the next slide).

Slideshow Pause and Autoplay

Set slideshow pause to “On” if you want slideshow to be paused when you roll mouse over slideshow.

You can also turn on/off slideshow autoplay.

You can choose whether to show navigation arrows in slideshow or not. Arrows will be displayed only for high resolutions and will be replaced for devices.

Slideshow fixed height

Now you can make fixed height for slideshow easily by setting it height in **pixels**.

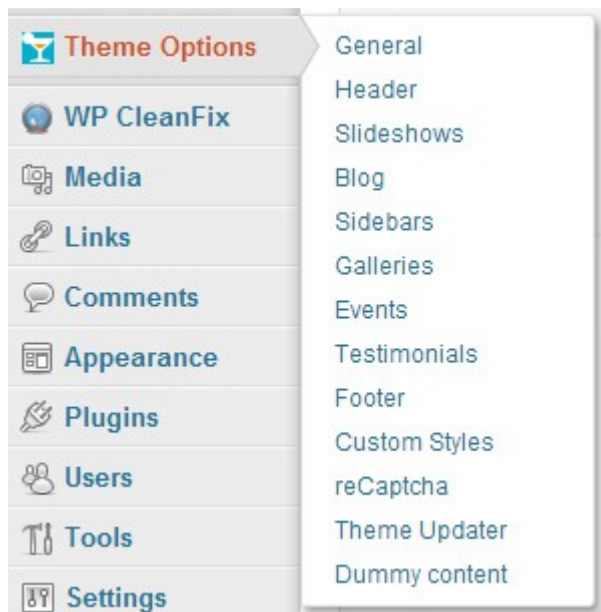

Sidebar Settings

With the sidebar tab you can create custom sidebars to use throughout your pages and posts.

To create/delete sidebars navigate to **Theme Options -> Sidebars** page at your Dashboard.



Adding a new sidebar

Simply type name for your sidebar and click “**Add sidebar**”.

For the sidebar names you are allowed to use uppercase, lowercase, numbers and underscores.

WordPress does not allow other characters or symbols so if you try to use them they will be stripped out.




Using your new sidebar

When editing your pages and posts there will be an option called “**Sidebar**” in “**Layout Type**” block. You can choose your custom sidebar here to use with that specific page or post.

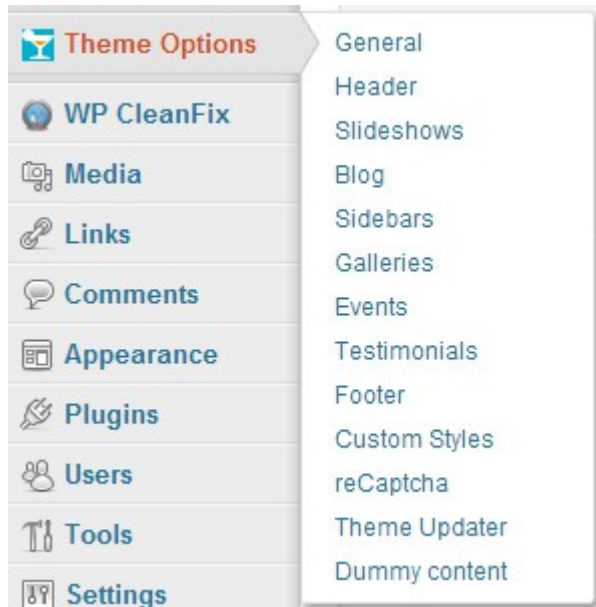
After creating your custom sidebars you need to add some widgets to them.

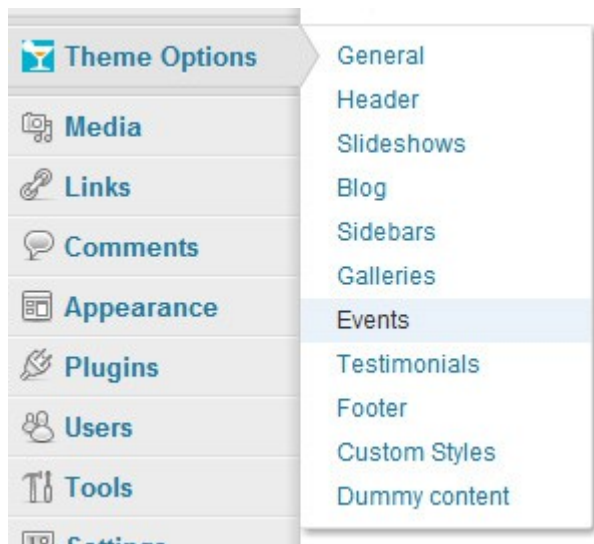

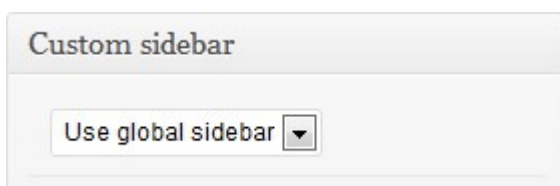
On the next image and in your dashboard you can see menu item called “Events” in “Theme Options”. This is where you can setup some global settings for your events.

Using global settings you can set, lets say same layout and sidebar for all event posts that you will create. But you can always overwrite this setting for each post. There are lots of setting below the editor, or at the left side, when you edit events post. [Check layout settings for event post.](#)

Note: To make global settings work you need to make sure that, for example, event post layout setting is set to **Use global** or **Use global Sidebar**

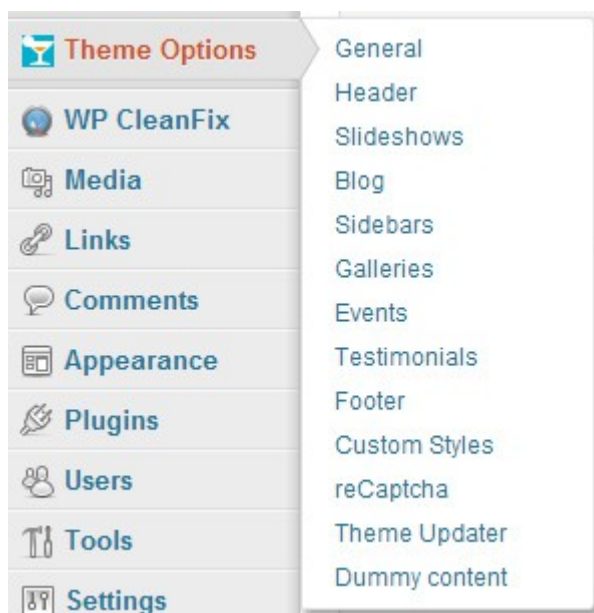

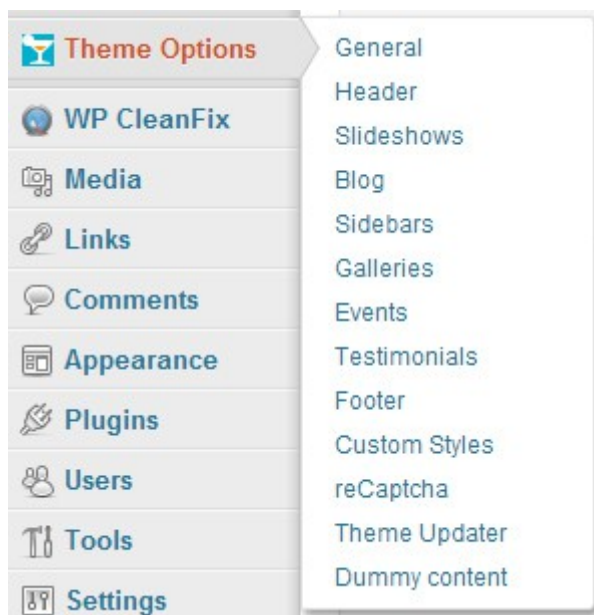

Footer Settings

Footer tab holds options which are all about configuring your footer part of website, such as: widgets area, colors, footer text. Also this is where you can add your google analytics code.

To edit Footer settings navigate to **Theme Options -> Footer** page at your Dashboard.



Footer widget area

You can have one widget area in footer with 1-4 columns. You can choose between how many columns you want by selecting number from “columns number for footer widget area” drop down. Columns will be stretched to cover the full width of footer area. I.E.: If you have a single widget it will be stretched to the full footer width, if you got 2 widgets, each of them will cover a 50% of a footer width.

You can disable the whole row of widgets in footer by switching off “Enable footer widget area” option.

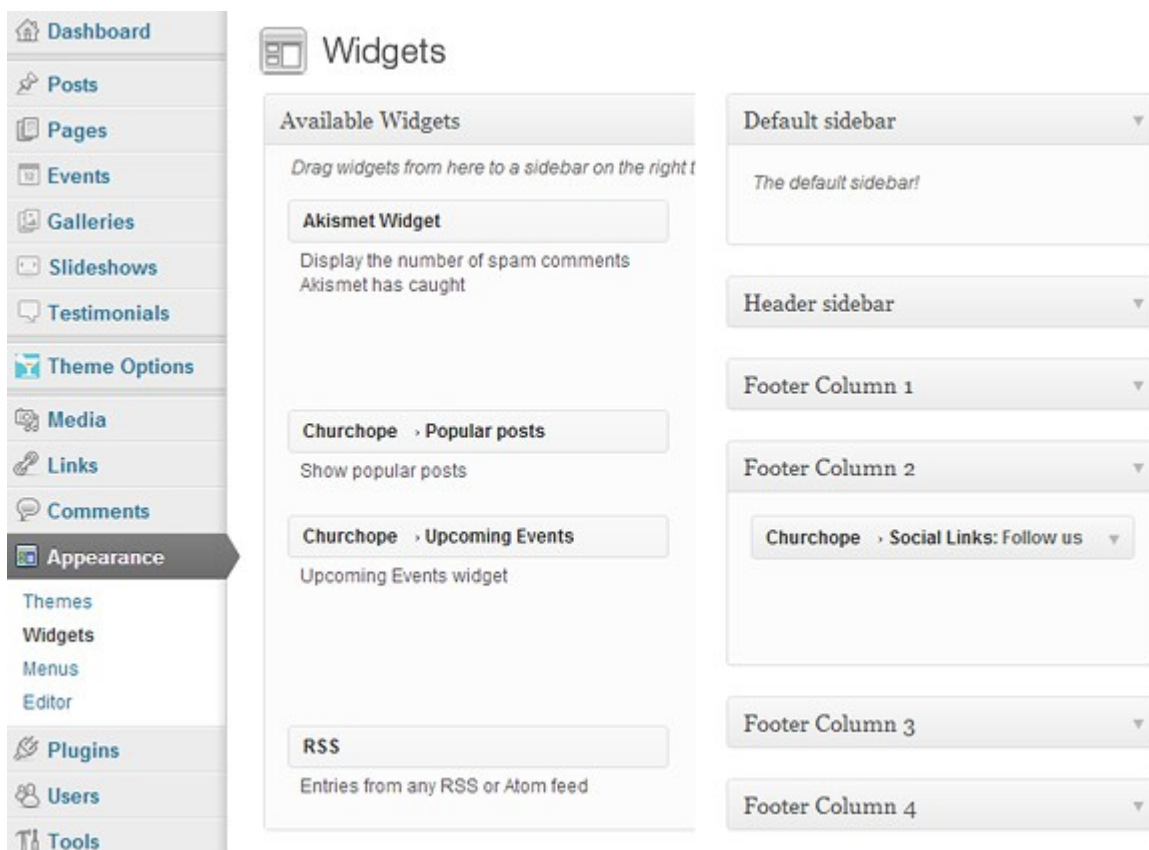

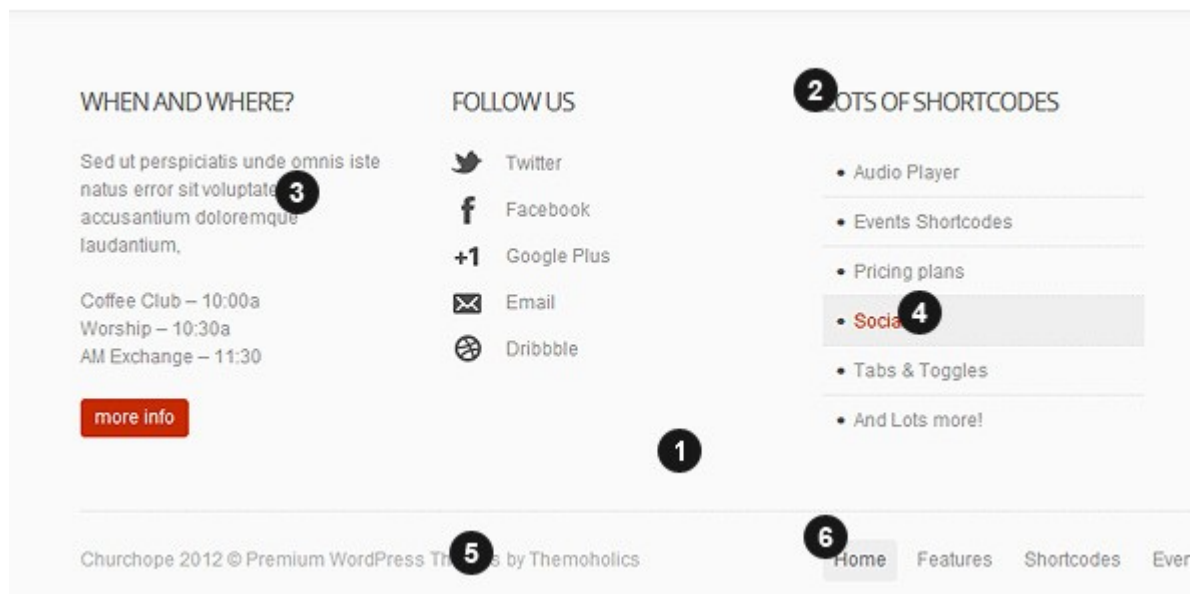

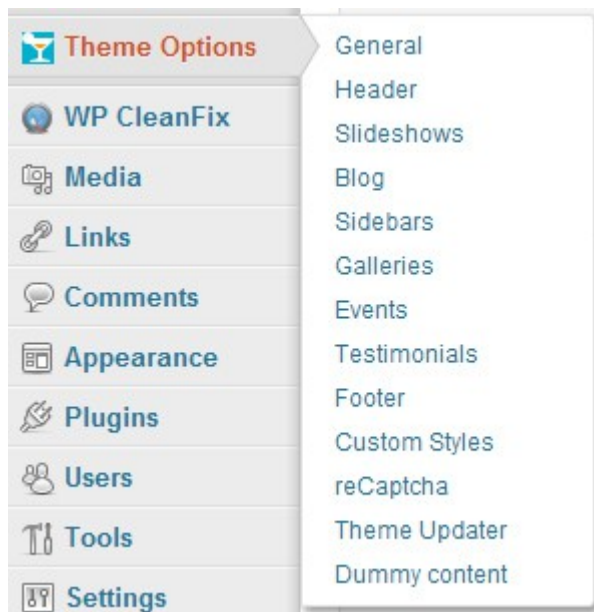

Custom Styles option allows you to add custom CSS rules from admin panel instead of editing core theme files.

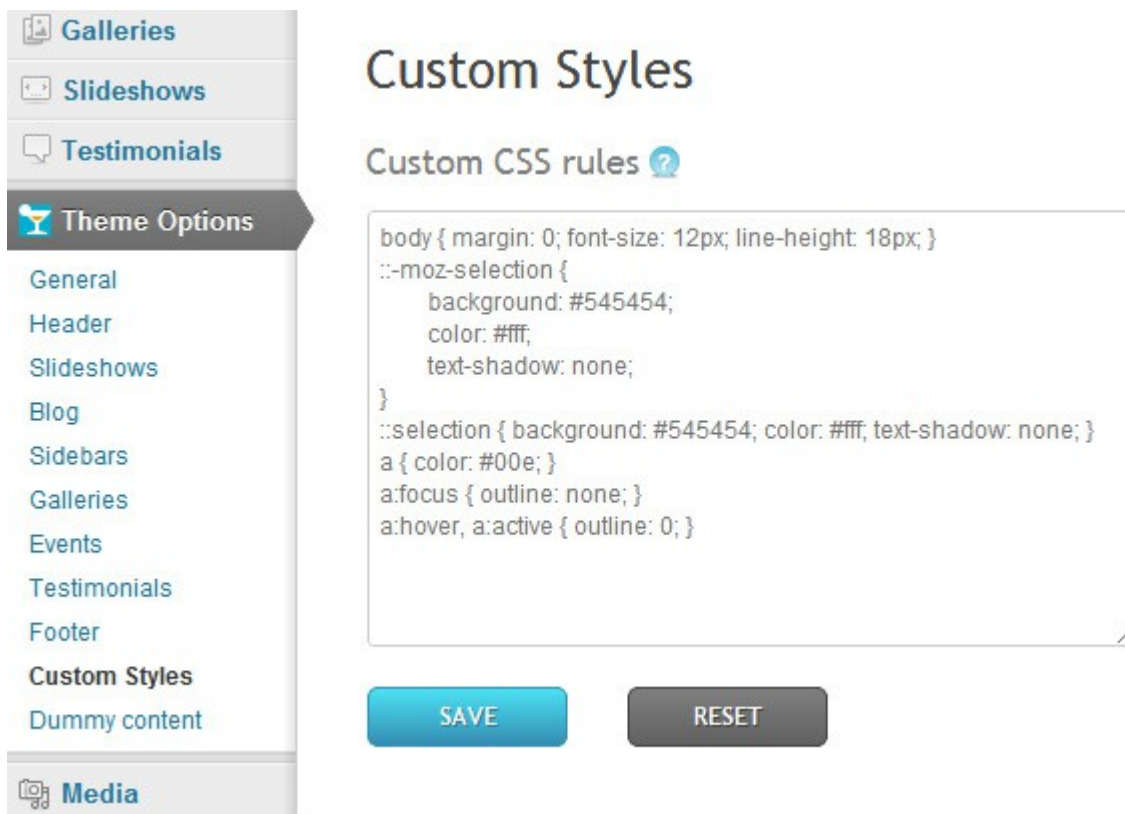
To add Custom Styles navigate to **Theme Options** -> **Custom Styles** page at your Dashboard.

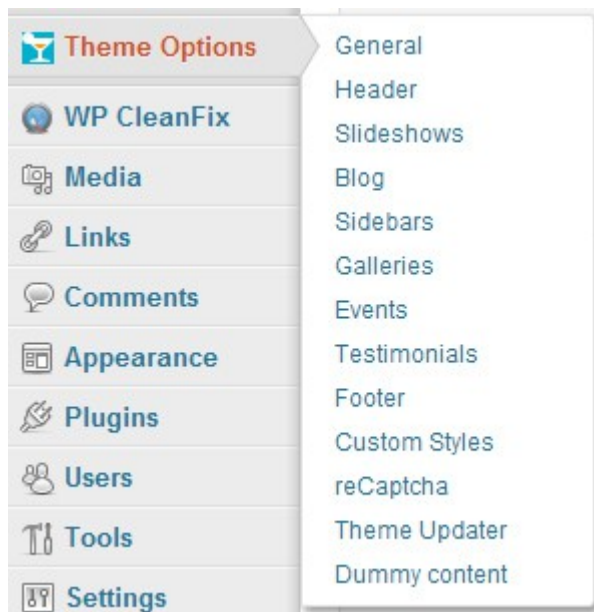

reCaptcha

Here you can find options related to the reCaptcha used in contact form shortcode.

To edit reCaptcha settings navigate to **Theme Options -> reCaptcha** page at your Dashboard.

This options is available starting version 1.12 of our theme.



About Captcha

A CAPTCHA is a program that can tell whether its user is a human or a computer. You've probably seen them — colorful images with distorted text at the bottom of Web registration forms. CAPTCHAs are used by many websites to prevent abuse from “bots,” or automated programs usually written to generate spam. No computer program can read distorted text as well as humans can, so bots cannot navigate sites protected by CAPTCHAs.

Add reCaptcha

You can add reCaptcha to your [contact form](#). To do this simply check “Use reCaptcha” when you add shortcode. But to make reCaptcha work you need to add private & public key first.

Add Keys

To make reCaptcha work you need to add private & public key to the Theme Options -> reCaptcha and then click save.

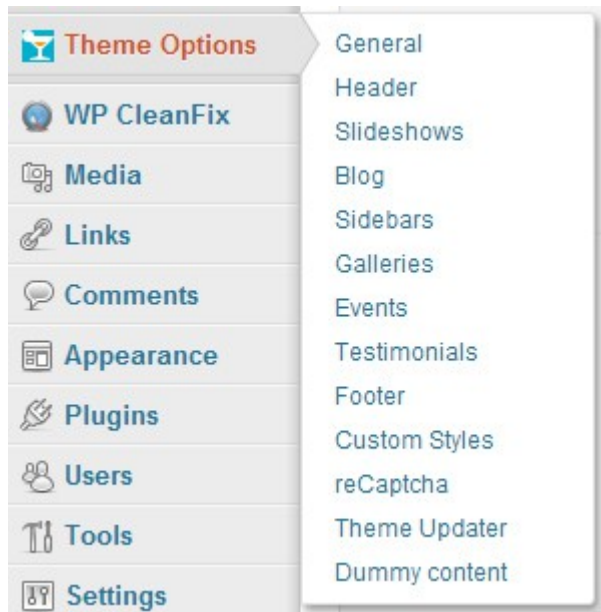

Dummy Content

Warning! DO NOT INSTALL dummy data on your live website. It will corrupt your existing data. We suggest you install dummy data only on clean WordPress setup.

This option is for those who are not very familiar with WordPress or don't want to setup our theme from the scratch. Installing dummy data allows you to see what's behind the scene of our preview and make setting up your website easier and faster.
