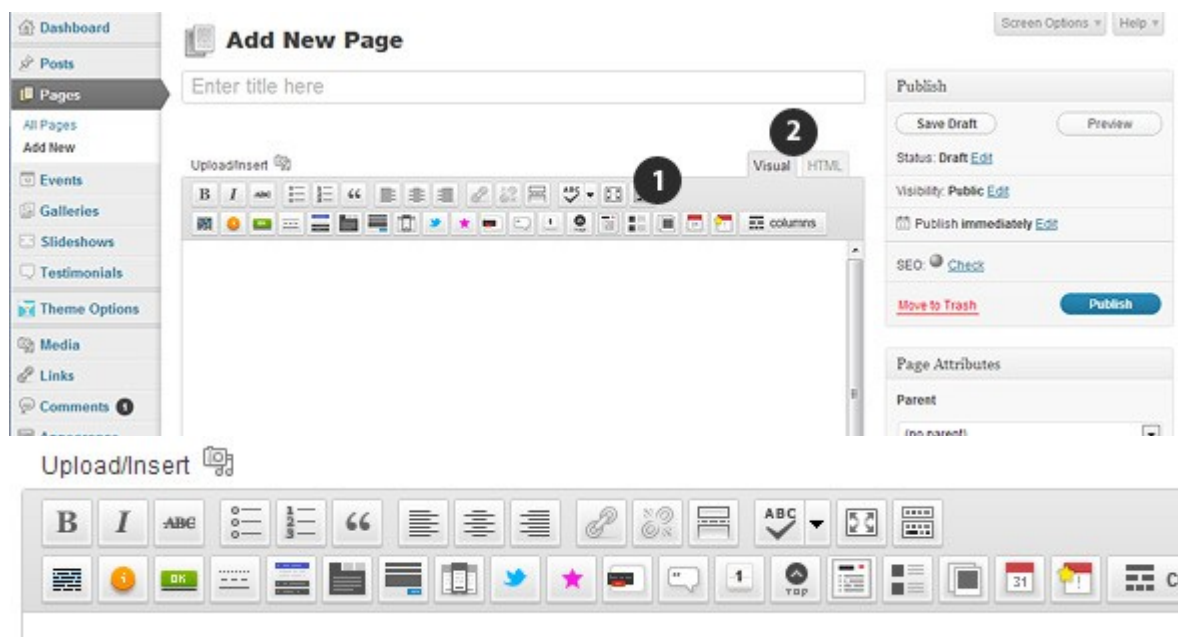
How To Use Shortcodes

Shortcodes are Integrated in default editor.

To make your life easier and prevent from possible errors/typos we integrated shortcodes in editor panel. So you don't need to remember all these shortcodes anymore! You can easily add any of them by simple click on shortcode buttons.

You can see where shortcode buttons (1) located on mimages below. When you edit page/post, switch to Visual (2) mode to see shortcode buttons.



We do not provide shortcodes list to prevent typos, that users do all the time. If you need to add any shortcode, do this by clicking on specific shortcode button.

Do NOT copy shortcodes code from examples or from dummy pages content! They may be outdated or have typos!

Shortcode Settings

After you click on shortcode button a popup with options will appear (or it will be added to content if it has no options).

Simply adjust settings in this popup, i.e.: gallery category, whether to use filter or not, how many to show per page, etc. And after you are done with settings, click **“Insert”** button.

Shortcode will be placed in content, inside your editor. Exactly where the syntax is placed depends on where your cursor is. So don't forget to place cursor in correct place in your content, before adding shortcode.

Adding Shortcodes to Widget.

You can add shortcodes in **Text** widget. As you can see on image, there are text info with button shortcode.

To add shortcode in widget:

1. Create new page
2. Click to add shortcode
3. Adjust settings
4. and insert it to page.
5. After that, copy shortcode code and paste it in Text widget.

Do NOT edit shortcodes code manually.

Blog Shortcode

How to add blog shortcode to page/post

To add blog shortcode to your page simply click on blog shortcode button, that can be found integrated in default editor panel in visual mode. See image below. Please note, that blog shortcode and page have different design.

Blog Shortcode Settings

"Category of blog" - you need to choose your blog category here. Post from this category will be displayed. If you don't have any posts and categories yet, then you need to create them first, before adding blog shortcode.

"Show per page" - you can define how many posts to show per page.

"Pagination" - You can choose whether to show pagination or not. If you turn off pagination, then only the set amount of posts in "show per page" field will be displayed.

After you are done with settings, click "Insert" button.

Shortcode will be placed in content, inside your editor. Exactly where the syntax is placed depends on where your cursor is. So don't forget to place cursor in correct place in your content, before adding shortcode.

Gallery Shortcode

How to add gallery to page/post

To add gallery to your page simply click on gallery shortcode button, that can be found integrated in default editor panel in visual mode. See image below.

Gallery Settings

Gallery shortcode comes with following options:

“**Taxonomy terms**” option allows you to choose one of gallery categories. If you want to use sortable gallery, you need to choose parent category of your sortable categories.

“**Filterable gallery**” – check this option if you want use filterable gallery.

“**Show per page**” – number of gallery posts per page.

“Pagination” – Check this option if you want show pagination. Please note, that you cannot use pagination in sortable gallery.

“Layout Type” option allows you to choose one of the 3 available gallery layouts: “Big”, “Medium”, “Small”.

After you are done with settings, click “Insert” button.

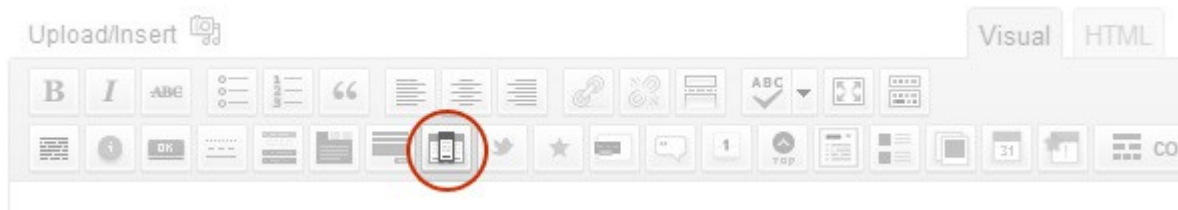
Shortcode will be placed in content, inside your editor. Exactly where the syntax is placed depends on where your cursor is. So don’t forget to place cursor in correct place in your content, before adding shortcode.

Please note, that you can not have “Filterable gallery” with “Pagination”.

Pricing Plan Shortcode

How to add pricing plans to page/post

To add pricing plans to your page simply click on pricing plans shortcode button, that can be found integrated in default editor panel in visual mode. See image below.

Pricing Plans Settings

Pricing plans settings comes with simple text fields, where you can fill in title, price, offer text, button text and url and also color.

“Button Color” allows you to set color for call to action button, it will set same for all plans. You can make all buttons with different color by changing button color directly in shortcode code. But make sure you don’t cut any code! Color should be in following format, i.e.: #c62b02.

“Offers count” block allows you to set how many plans will be in table (in our example it is 3).

after you are done with settings, click “Insert” button.

Shortcode will be placed in content, inside your editor. Exactly where the syntax is placed depends on where your cursor is. So don’t forget to place cursor in correct place in your content, before adding shortcode.

Social Shortcodes

How to add Social Icons to page/post

To add social icons to your page simply click “Social Link” shortcode button, that can be found integrated in default editor panel in visual mode. See image below.

Social Link Settings

Social Link shortcode comes with following options:

“**Type of Button**” option allows you to choose one of the 11 available button types: “RSS”, “Facebook”, “Twitter”, “Dribbble”, “Email to”, “Google+”, “Flickr”, “Vimeo”, “LindedIn”, “Youtube”, “Pinterest”. Choose the one you need and it will be possible to preview it in block below.

“**URL for Button**” – a link for you social button.

“**Link target**” – you can check this option to open button link in a new window.

After you are done with settings, click “Insert” button.

Shortcode will be placed in content, inside your editor. Exactly where the syntax is placed depends on where your cursor is. So don’t forget to place cursor in correct place in your content, before adding shortcode.

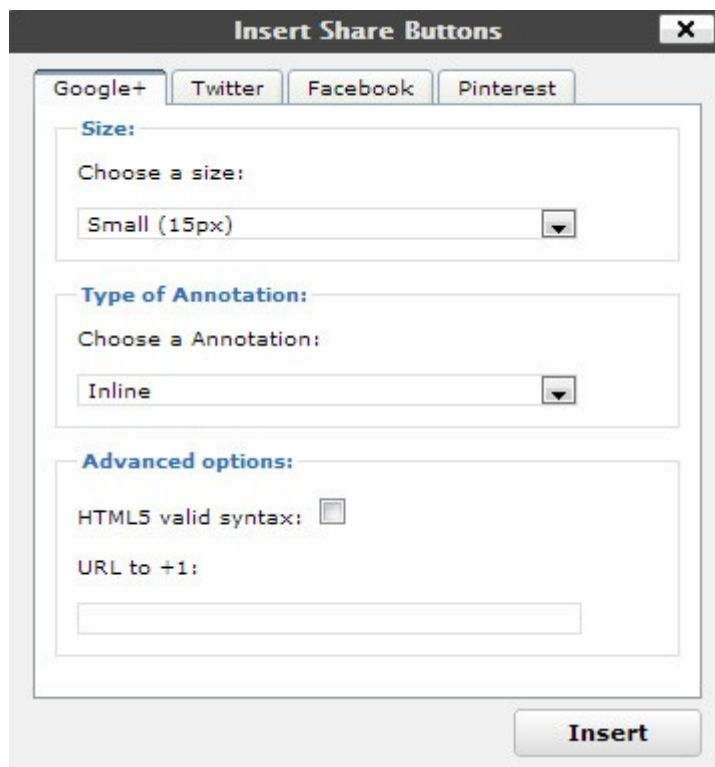
How to add Share Buttons to page/post

To add share buttons to your page simply click on Share Button shortcode button, that can be found integrated in default editor panel in visual mode. See image below.



Share Button Settings

Share Button shortcode comes with 4 tabs: “Google+”, “Twitter”, “Facebook”, “Pinterest”. Each of these tabs has its own options.



Google+

Google+ tab comes with following options:


“Size” option allows you to choose one of the provided button sizes: “Small (15px)”, “Standard (24px)”, “Medium (20px)”, “Tall (60px)”.

“**Type of Annotation**” option allows you to choose type of annotation for your share button or disable the annotation.

In “**Advanced options**” you can fill your URL to +1 and check “HTML5 valid syntax” checkbox, if you need HTML5 valid html-syntax.

After you are done with settings, click “Insert” button.

Shortcode will be placed in content, inside your editor. Exactly where the syntax is placed depends on where your cursor is. So don’t forget to place cursor in correct place in your content, before adding shortcode.

Twitter

Twitter tab comes with following options:

“**Count box position**” allows you to choose count box position to be horizontal or vertical, or you can disable it.

Check **“Button size”** checkbox, if you want your twitter button be double-sized.

“URL of the page to share” option allows you to define a URL of page to share. Leave it blank to use URL of your editing page.


“Recommended accounts” field allows you to define a recommended Twitter accounts.

“Via user” option allows you to choose, via which Twitter user you want to share your page.

“Default Tweet text” is the text, which will be posted by default.

After you are done with settings, click **“Insert”** button.

Shortcode will be placed in content, inside your editor. Exactly where the syntax is placed depends on where your cursor is. So don't forget to place cursor in correct place in your content, before adding shortcode.

Facebook

Facebook tab comes with following options:

“URL to Like” – you can define, which URL you want to share.

“Send Button” – check this option to add send button.

“Layout Style” option allows you to choose share button layout style. “Standard”, “Button Count” and “Box Count” styles is available.

“Width” – define your button width in pixels.


“Show profile picture” – check this option, if you want to show Facebook users profile photo.

“Verb to display” – select a button text to display. “Like” and “Recommend” verbs are available.

“Color Scheme” option allow you to choose light or dark color scheme of your button.

After you are done with settings, click **“Insert”** button.

Shortcode will be placed in content, inside your editor. Exactly where the syntax is placed depends on where your cursor is. So don't forget to place cursor in correct place in your content, before adding shortcode.

Pinterest

Pinterest tab comes with following options:

“Page the pin is on” – specify URL of your page.

“Image to be pinned” – specify URL of your image.

“Pin Count” option allows you to choose horizontal or vertical layout, or to disable Pin Count.

“What they're pinning” option allows you to specify the description of your pinning.

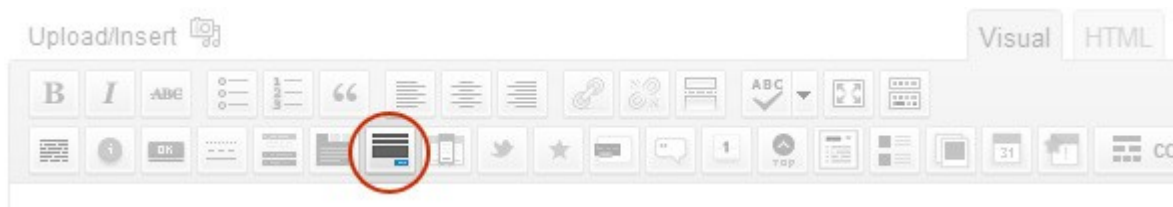
After you are done with settings, click “Insert” button.

Shortcode will be placed in content, inside your editor. Exactly where the syntax is placed depends on where your cursor is. So don't forget to place cursor in correct place in your content, before adding shortcode.

Contact Form Builder

You can create any form you need with our contact form shortcode builder!

To add contact form to your page simply click on “Insert Contact Form” shortcode button, that can be found integrated in default editor panel in visual mode.



After you have clicked, the pop-up window with builder will appear where you can add/remove different fields and set up your email settings.

1. Contact Form Fields Position

This block allows you to set up the structure of your contact form. It comes with 4 default form fields that can be changed: replaced, added, edited and also deleted.

You can replace the field, simply place the mouse on “move” at the right of existing field and drag it up or down and also delete the field by clicking the “minus” button on the same with the field line.

2. Add a New Field

This button allows you to add the new field. Simply click it and the field will appear exactly at the bottom of the block.

3. Email Settings

This block comes with two editing text fields:

“**Enter your email address**” comes with the default address that was set up while you were creating the site and can be found at your Dashboard->Settings->General. You can also place another address here but you should make sure that it is valid otherwise emails will be sent to your default address.

“**What should the subject line be**” – place the subject of your incoming emails here.

4. Field Customizing

This block allows you set up any field you want, which make the contact form very flexible.

Here you can set up your field’s label, select the necessary type and also check “**Required?**” if you want to make information in the field compulsory.

5. Types of the Field

This dropdown menu, from the above image, allows you to choose one of the different views of your field: “**Checkbox**”, “**Dropdown**”, “**Text**”, “**Textarea**”, “**Radio**”, “**Website**”, “**Name**”. Also depending on a selected type, there may come some other settings, which will help you to adjust more precise details of your field.

6. reCaptcha

This options is available starting version 1.12 of our theme.

You can add reCaptcha to your form. To do this simply check “Use reCaptcha”. But to make reCaptcha work you need to setup it at Theme Options-> reCaptcha.

About Captcha

A CAPTCHA is a program that can tell whether its user is a human or a computer. You’ve probably seen them — colorful images with distorted text at the bottom of Web registration forms.

CAPTCHAs are used by many websites to prevent abuse from “bots,” or automated programs usually written to generate spam. No computer program can read distorted text as well as humans can, so bots cannot navigate sites protected by CAPTCHAs.

7. Add Contact Form to Page/Post

After you have finished with the settings, press the “**Add this form to my post**” button. Shortcode will be placed in content, inside your editor exactly where the syntax is placed, depends on where your cursor is. So don’t forget to place cursor in correct place in your content, before adding shortcode.

Teaser Shortcode

How to add Teaser to your page/post?

To add teasers to your page/post simply click “Insert Teaser” shortcode button, that can be found integrated in default editor panel in visual mode like in the image.

Teaser Settings

Teaser's settings comes with simple text fields, where you can fill in title, button title, image and button URLs and also a template dropdown menu.

“Choose a template:” allows you to set a template which you want to be shown at your teaser.

“Image src:” allows you to set the image URL that will be shown at your teaser further.

“Button title:” field allows you to specify the name of the button: more... or learn more... for example.

“URL for button:” field allows you to specify the path to necessary content after pressing the button.

“Target blank:” checkbox allows you to choose the way which your teaser will be opened further: in the same window if default or in the new if checked

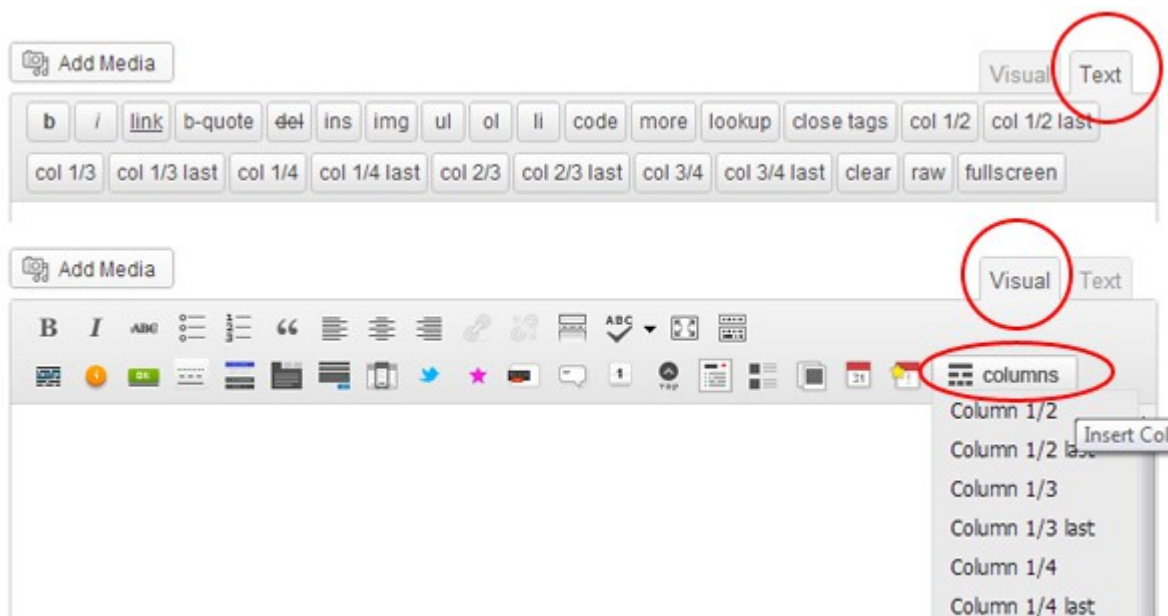
Once you have finished with your settings, press “Insert” button.

Shortcode will be placed in content, inside your editor. Exactly where the syntax is placed depends on where your cursor is. So don't forget to place cursor in correct place in your content, before adding shortcode.

Column Shortcodes

How to align content page/post

To align content on your page simply click on columns shortcode button, that can be found integrated in default editor panel in visual mode, than insert your content between the opening and closing tags of the inserted code. See image below.



Columns Shortcode Options

Columns shortcode comes with following options:

“**Column 1/2**” option allows you to insert a “half width column” shortcode. Content between the opening and closing tags of this shortcode will take up a half of full width column.

“**Column 1/3**” option allows you to insert a “one-third” shortcode. Content between the opening and closing tags of this shortcode will take up a third of a full width column.

“**Column 1/4**” option allows you to insert a “one-fourth” shortcode. Content between the opening and closing tags of this shortcode will take up a quarter of a full width column.

“**Column 2/3**” option allows you to insert a “two-third” shortcode. Content between the opening and closing tags of this shortcode will take up a two thirds of a full width column.

“**Column 3/4**” option allows you to insert a “three-fourth” shortcode. Content between the opening and closing tags of this shortcode will take up a three quarters of a full width column.

Clear

“**Clear**” option allows you to insert a “clear” shortcode. This shortcode will force downstream content to display in a new row.

You should insert “**Clear**” shortcode after every last column in your row. Otherwise your downstream content can appear in a top row.

Last

Each of “Column” option also has a “Last” modifier. I.E.: “Column 1/2 last”, “Column 1/3 last”, “Column 1/4 last”, etc.

You should use shortcode with “**Last**” modifier for every last column in your row. Otherwise your last column will be displayed in a new row.

Insert shortcode

After you click on shortcode button it will be placed in content, inside your editor. Exactly where the syntax is placed depends on where your cursor is. So don’t forget to place cursor in correct place in your content, before adding shortcode.

Lets see how it works

Below you can see two blocks, made using column shortcodes.

First of a half width column

Second of a half width column

Lets check the code:

```
[one_half] First of a half width column [/one_half]
[one_half last=last] Second of a half width column [/one_half]
[clear]
```

Conclusion

So, as you can see from code example, the first column made using “one_half” shortcode and the second, which is the last one, has last modifier “one_half last=last”. At the very end of column shortcodes group we have “clear” to, let’s call it “close” our column group.

Event Shortcodes

How to add upcoming events to page/post

To add upcoming events to your page simply click on upcoming events shortcode button, that can be found integrated in default editor panel in visual mode. See image below.

Upcoming Events Settings

Upcoming Events shortcode comes with following options:

“Event category” option allows you to choose one of your event categories to show.

“Displaying Count” option allows you to specify a number shown upcoming events.

“Show event time” – you can check this option to show upcoming event time.

“Show event place” – you can check this option to show upcoming event place.

“Show event phone” – you can check this option to show upcoming event phone.

After you are done with settings, click “Insert” button.

Shortcode will be placed in content, inside your editor. Exactly where the syntax is placed depends on where your cursor is. So don’t forget to place cursor in correct place in your content, before adding shortcode.

How to add Events Calendar to page/post

To add events calendar to your page simply click on events calendar shortcode button, that can be found integrated in default editor panel in visual mode. See image below.

Events Calendar Settings

Events Calendar shortcode comes with following options:

“**Category of event**” option allows you to select one or more of your event categories to show in events calendar. If you want to select all categories, do not choose none of the categories from the list.

“**Date range**” option allows you to specify an event begin and finish date.

“**Type of layout**” option allows you to choose one of two available layout: “Full” and “Active”. Full layout will show full calendar. Active layout will show only those days which was set in events.

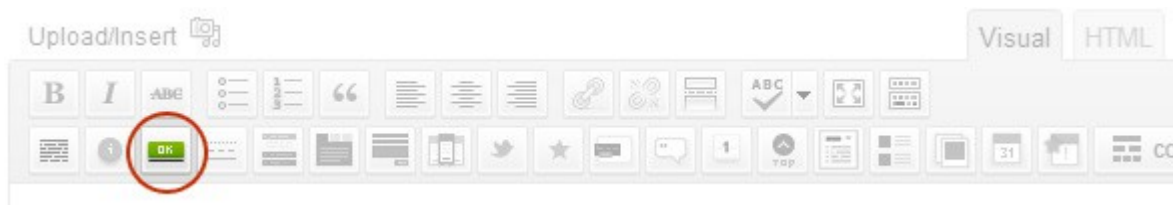
After you are done with settings, click “Insert” button.

Shortcode will be placed in content, inside your editor. Exactly where the syntax is placed depends on where your cursor is. So don’t forget to place cursor in correct place in your content, before adding shortcode.

Buttons

How to add buttons to page/post

To add buttons to your page simply click on buttons shortcode button, that can be found integrated in default editor panel in visual mode. See image below.

Buttons Settings

Buttons shortcode comes with following options:

“Type of Button” option allows you to choose one of the 3 available button styles: “Simple button”, “Simply button black”, “Big Color Button”. Choose the one you need and it will be possible to preview it in block below.

“URL for Button” – a link for you button.

“Link target” - you can check this option to open button link in a new window.

“Use as Download” - by default if you add link to your file, it will be opened in browser. If you want it to be downloaded, then you need to check this option.

“Change Color” - You can set any color for each button style.

After you are done with settings, click “Insert” button.

Shortcode will be placed in content, inside your editor. Exactly where the syntax is placed depends on where your cursor is. So don't forget to place cursor in correct place in your content, before adding shortcode.

Tabs

How to add Tabs at your page/post?

To add tabs to your page/post simply click the “Insert Tabs” shortcode button, that can be found integrated in default editor panel in visual mode like in the image.



How to edit Tabs?

Type your tab's title in the quotes

```
[tab title="..."]
```

and place content between tab tags

```
[tab title="Tab 1"]...[/tab]
```

How to add more Tabs?

To add new tab simply add new line in tab group:

```
[tab title="some title"]... [/tab]
```

Toggles

How to add Toggles at your page/post?

To add toggles to your page/post press the “Insert Toggle” shortcode button, that can be found integrated in default editor panel in visual mode like in the image.

Toggle's Settings

Toggle's settings comes with simple text field, where you can fill in title and dropdown menu, where you can select the type of your toggle.

“Type of toggle” dropdown menu allows you to set the color of your toggle. It can be white or gray.

“Opened by default” checkbox allows your toggle to be opened or not by default.

Once you have finished with your settings, press “Insert” button.

Shortcode will be placed in content, inside your editor. Exactly where the syntax is placed depends on where your cursor is. So don't forget to place cursor in correct place in your content, before adding shortcode.

Active Toggle

You can make toggle opened by default by adding following code inside toggle shortcode tag or by checking “Opened by default” in shortcode options:

active="active"
```

Example:

How to add Testimonials to your page/post?

To add testimonials to your page/post simply click “Testimonials” shortcode button, that can be found integrated in default editor panel in visual mode like in the image.

Testimonials Settings

Testimonials settings comes with simple text field, where you can set the interval between the further testimonials and dropdown menus, where you can select categories and effects of shown ones.

“Testimonial Category:” dropdown menu allows you to set the category separately or select all categories that will be shown further.

“Number of second to show:” field allows you to set the interval between the upcoming testimonials.

“Randomize testimonial:” checkbox allows you to select the order of displayed testimonials.

“Transition effect:” dropdown menu allows you to select the effect of displayed testimonials.

Once you have finished with your settings, press “Insert” button.
